#### PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS for 2016:

#### **Annual General Meeting and Training Symposium:**

In April, the 2016 Annual General Meeting and Symposium was held in Winnipeg, Manitoba.

The Winnipeg Block Parent<sup>®</sup> Program held its Annual General Meeting prior to the Symposium. This was truly a special occasion, recognizing long service volunteers with a service award pin and certificate. While not all of the volunteers being recognized for their service to the Winnipeg Block Parent<sup>®</sup> Program were able to attend the AGM, there were a total of 17 volunteers receiving a 35 year service award pin and 39 volunteers receiving a 40 year service award pin.

George and Geri Jarvis did a fantastic job in organizing the BPPCI Symposium and AGM.

Presentations were made by Graham Milliken from the Canadian Centre for Child Protection which is a National non-profit organization that addresses missing and/or abused children and provides child education and internet safety education. The organization also produces internet and safety guides for parents of children that are age specific.

Patrol Sergeant Phil Penner from the Winnipeg Police Service provided an open discussion on predators, neighbourhood watch and 911 guidelines.

Ryan Sereda provided a demonstration of the computer application that has been developed by the Winnipeg Block Parent<sup>®</sup> Program to identify Block Parent<sup>®</sup> homes and Business Block Parent<sup>®</sup> locations in Winnipeg. The application also links to current incident locations in Winnipeg. Information is imported from Google Alerts into the map. There is no cost to develop the map. Other Provincial Block Parent<sup>®</sup> Programs expressed an interest in obtaining additional information of the application for use in their Programs.

#### National Block Parent<sup>®</sup> Week:

The theme for the 2016 Block Parent<sup>®</sup> Week was "**First Sign of a Safe Community**". During National Block Parent<sup>®</sup> Week, we encourage families and small businesses to become a Block Parent<sup>®</sup> and help us to continue to protect communities coast to coast.

The poster for our 48<sup>th</sup> year depicts our very recognizable Block Parent® road sign at the entrance to a small community. The poster was designed by Ryan Sereda of the Block Parent® Program of Winnipeg and newest member of the Board of Directors. Thank-you Ryan.



#### **New Block Parent<sup>®</sup> Programs:**

The Program continues to attract Block Parent<sup>®</sup> volunteers as well as Business Block Parent<sup>®</sup> volunteers.

New community Programs have been established in Binbrook, ON; Oka, QC and Cochrane, AB. Additional Programs have been re-established in St. Catharines, ON and Lethbridge, AB.

New Business Block Parent<sup>®</sup> locations have been established in Stony Plain, AB; Kincardine, ON; Port Elgin, ON and Stoney Creek, ON.

#### **PARTNERSHIPS**

The Program is characterized by a close working relationship with police, government departments, education and other community partners. This ongoing partnership is the basis for the continued success of the Program across Canada with the National and Provincial/Territorial boards or committees having a police liaison.

The BPPCI Board of Directors is committed to working with and supporting all levels of the Program on a personal level, by providing and circulating printed materials and public service announcements and by fostering effective communication. BPPCI received 434 requests from across Canada for information on how to become a Block Parent<sup>®</sup> volunteer. BPPCI continues to search for new partnership opportunities while fostering existing partnerships.

The National Block Parent<sup>®</sup> Program is contacted throughout the year by individuals or groups who are interested in establishing new local community Programs. A package of background information of the Program containing helpful tips in Program start-up, forms, sample brochures etc., is distributed upon request.
